Ka'ie'ie Mauka Facility Improvements Project Information Sheet

Scope of Project:

This project will replace and improve existing infrastructure in the Kaʻieʻie Mauka area of the Pāpaʻikou water system. The project includes the construction of a new control building, chemical injection system, waterline upgrades from 3-inch to 6-inch pipes, improvements to the Supervisory Control And Data Acquisition (SCADA) system, chlorination system, well discharge piping and the relocation of the existing booster pump station to the department's Kaʻieʻie Mauka well property. Associated demolition work; roadway paving; chain link fencing; mechanical, electrical and structural work, will also be included.

General Contractor:

Isemoto Contracting Co., Ltd.

Construction Schedule:

Construction started in December 2018 and is expected to end in December 2019. The contractor will have 365 calendar days to complete this project.

Project Cost:

Project total cost is \$2,200,000.00. Funding for the project will be from the State of Hawai'i Drinking Water State Revolving Fund.
