- 5) POWER COST CHARGE:

Departmental power costs from all power sources <u>increased</u> since the last Power Cost Charge rate was determined. The Department proposes to increase the Power Cost Charge from \$1.85 to \$2.15 per thousand gallons as a result of this increase. Power cost charges over the past two years were as follows:

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> It is recommended that the Board approve the increase of the Power Cost Charge from \$1.85 to \$2.15, effective November 1, 2021.

### 6) <u>SOUTH HILO</u>:

## A. VEHICLE BID NO. 2020-04, FURNISHING AND DELIVERING VEHICLES TO THE DEPARTMENT OF WATER SUPPLY - REQUEST FOR TIME EXTENSION:

The vendor, IK Motors, Inc., dba Kama'aina Motors, is requesting a contract time extension of 45 calendar days for Parts A & G. The delivery of the vehicles is being delayed due to shipping issues brought on by the COVID-19 pandemic. Declined production in the industry resulted in more infrequent barge sails from San Diego, California, to Hilo, Hawai'i. These delays are beyond the control of the vendor. *Note: There are no additional costs associated with this time extension*.

1<sup>st</sup> time extension – 63 calendar days Parts A & G (*Building delay due to micro-chip shortage*) 2<sup>nd</sup> time extension – 45 calendar days Parts A & G (*Shipping delays caused by pandemic*)

<u>RECOMMENDATION:</u> It is recommended that the Board approve a contract time extension of an additional 45 calendar days for Parts A & G to IK Motors, Inc., dba Kama'aina Motors, for VEHICLE BID NO. 2020-04. If approved, the contract completion date will be revised from November 16, 2021, to December 30, 2021, for Parts A & G.

## A. JOB NO. 2021-1177, HĀWĪ #2 BOOSTER C REPAIR:

This project consists of furnishing all labor, materials, tools and equipment necessary to replace one (1) booster pump assembly; replace selected portions discharge piping, chlorinate the pumping assembly; and complete an efficiency test; in accordance with the specifications.

Bids for this project were opened on October 7, 2021, at 2:00 p.m., and the following are the bid results:

Total Cost: \$97,900.00

Funding for this project will be from DWS' Energy CIP. The contractor will have 240 calendar days to complete this project. The Engineering estimate for this project was \$125,000.00.

Original Installation: March 1997

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board award the contract for JOB NO. 2021-1177, HĀWĪ #2 BOOSTER C REPAIR, to the lowest responsible bidder, Derrick's Well Drilling & Pump Services, LLC, for their bid amount of \$89,000.00, plus \$8,900.00 for contingencies, for a total contract amount of \$97,900.00. It is further recommended that either the Chairperson or the Vice-Chairperson be authorized to sign the contract, subject to review as to form and legality by Corporation Counsel.
